Arrival in Ulaanbaatar

Lodging in hotel in UB

We will gather you from the airport and transfer to hotel in Ulaanbaatar. While you settle in, you may rest in the hotel, or we can begin venturing out to see local museums and markets in the capital city of Mongolia. Dinner at local restaurant.



Fly 2.5 hours to Ulgii

Lodging in ger with detached bathroom at Kerim Tour Ger Camp

Arrive in Ulgii city via plane. Visit local markets and museum. Visit local restaurants for lunch and dinner. Spend the night in Kerim Tour ger camp in Ulgii.



Eagle Hunt Lodging in ger camp

We will begin to learn about western Mongolia and the Kazakh way of life with a drive through the beautiful mountainous region via Tolbo lake.

We will then drive approximately 4 hours to meet a local eagle hunter and his family. We will be hosted in a ger for the next 4 days. Each day we will embark on horseback with our local guide/eagle hunter to hunt for small game including rabbit and fox.







Return to Ulgii

Lodging in ger at Kerim Tour Ger Camp

Return to Ulgii by the evening and stay in Kerim Tour Ger Camp. We will rest and prepare for the Eagle Festival starting the next day.

Oct 7

Depart Ulgii to return to Ulaanbaatar by plane Lodging at Hotel in UB

Arrive in Ulaanbaatar and settle into hotel. Local tours and events as allowed by time.



Last day

Depending on your flight time we can visit local museums, cultural events, and markets. Opportunity to tour nearby Genghis Khan Memorial and the Black Market.

Transfer to airport as needed for flight and depart the country.
